June & July Highlights

- The May Arboretum celebrated their volunteers' accomplishments with a summer barbecue and award ceremony on Thursday, June 20. Twelve volunteers received a lapel pin and certificates hand signed by Governor Steve Sisolak for serving over 200 hours in the past year. One additional volunteer, Beverly Treadway, received a certificate from the governor for her significant leadership role in addressing an unmet need the creation of the Arboretum bimonthly volunteer newsletter "Arboretum Connections".
- Patagonia employees have been very active in the community lately and we have been fortunate
 to host volunteer groups at both the Basque Monument at Rancho San Rafael and Davis Creek
 Regional Park. There is also a regular group of volunteers that come every Thursday to work on
 improvements for the Urban Roots camp within the Nevada Farms and Families area of Rancho.
- Various Boy Scout Troops (Pack 443, 110, 500) have volunteered their time to assist with the Lazy 5 Regional Park Concert Series, specifically cleaning up litter after the concerts.
 Approximately ten Boy Scouts will participate for up to two hours each week.
- July is normally a somewhat slow time of year for volunteering due to the heat and people taking vacations. Last year, however, the heat and smoke were especially bad. We have been fortunate to benefit from a few additional groups and individual volunteers this July due to the milder conditions.

August Highlights

- One of the volunteer positions we have for individuals is that of a "Trail Monitors". One such trial monitor named Steve Olson spends 5-10 hours a month working on sections of the lower Galena Creek Trail. We so appreciate not only the work he does, but having another set of eyes and ears on the trail to keep us informed of any potential problems.
- Davis Creek has been enjoying a rotating group of missionaries who work on raking up areas of the park during their off time. This month, those couple of hours here and there ended up totaling 76.5 hours!
- The Summer Youth Employment group contributed over 500 hours to the total this month with 354 of those hours spent refurbishing picnic tables and raking pine needles at Galena Creek Regional Park while the rest of the hours were spent on weed abatement at Rancho San Rafael.
- The Regional Shooting Facility (RSF) has a new volunteer named John Macdonald. Since July, he
 has already volunteered 160 hours! All Regional Shooting Facility volunteers are certified Range
 Safety Officers through the National Rifle Association of America. In total, the RSF had 271
 volunteer hours over the past month.
