The baseline

- STRs exist in unincorporated Washoe County
- BCC: establish standards for STRs
- BCC: banning STRs is not feasible
- County-wide ordinance (plus Incline standards?)
- Intent is to be cost-neutral i.e. Fees and fines for STRs will pay for running the program and STR compliance efforts, including required inspections
- MANY perspectives exist
- Consensus unlikely; compromise is necessary





The baseline (continued)

- Not defined by County Development Code; no standards currently exist
- Identify STR impacts and if/how to address them (if not already covered by current code)
- Opportunity to establish permit process & standards
- Standards likely to evolve over time
- Enforcement of standards is critical
- Encourage public to participate and be heard





What's the County's intent?

Adopt simple, fair and enforceable regulations for short-term rentals that balance competing interests and maximize voluntary compliance.



What are some misconceptions?

- "Properties in Reno/Sparks will be impacted"
- "A ban on STRs is feasible"
- "Changing room tax distribution is on the table"
- "The County gets millions of dollars per year from room tax for short term rentals"
- "Agencies would not be reimbursed for fire or safety inspections"





W What are some misconceptions?

- "No additional staff are expected to implement or enforce the program"
- "General taxpayer dollars are planned to be used to support and enforce the STR program"
- "There are no community benefits to STRs"
- "This is our only chance to get it right"
- "The County's mind is already made up"





What's already being done?

- Trash, parking & noise regulated in general (not specific to STRs)
 - Nuisance Code
 - IVGID standards
 - Sheriff ordinances (ex. disturbing the peace)
- Room tax collected through RSCVA
 - Airbnb, property management companies, and ±180 directly registered STRs
 - Separate process; change not part of these efforts





What have we already heard?

- Permitting process: ex. fees, fines, review times, etc.
- Fire and guest safety: ex. defensible space, smoke detectors, structures meeting code standards, etc.
- Occupancy limits: ex. number of guests allowed per room, home, etc.
- Parking: ex. adequate off-street parking spaces, designated parking areas, etc.
- **Trash:** ex. placement/volume, bear-proofing, etc.
- Noise: ex. excessive noise, late-night/early-morning





Insights from last week

- Permitting process: reasonable fees, simple regs, different permit types, wide-ranging education
- Fire and guest safety: inspections, safety training, managing renter guests, maintenance standards
- Occupancy limits: conversions, ADA, property damage, inspections, # guests per room
- Parking: not enough available, in ROW, guest limits
- Trash/Noise: quiet hours, guest dogs, visible trash
- Other: property rights, quantifying complaints, uniformly applying standards, HOAs, lake protection
