Proposed Changes to STR Permit Application Fees

Washoe County would like your input about potential changes to **permit application fees** for short-term rentals (STRs). **BACKGROUND**

In March 2021, the Board of County Commissioners adopted permit fees and standards for STRs to operate in the unincorporated County (i.e. outside the cities of Reno and Sparks). This included direction that STR permit fees cover the cost to administer the STR program. Initial fees were based on projections before the program was put into place, acknowledging that fees would need to be re-assessed over time to ensure this direction was met.

The STR program has been operating for two years, and recent assessments have determined that STR permit fees do not currently cover the staff time and resources required to adequately administer the program. Administration costs are significantly subsidized by the County's General Fund.

CURRENT FEES

CURRENT fees for STR permit applications can be viewed online here.

PROPOSED FEE CHANGES

To cover the costs of administering the STR program, initial permit and renewal fees are proposed to increase approximately \$250-\$350 depending on the specifics of the permit (ex. first time permit or renewal; inside or outside of Tahoe Basin; inspection or self-certification; etc.). Specific amounts are still to be determined.

Proposed Changes to STR Permit Application Fees (continued)

• Additional new fees are proposed for changing the local responsible party/agent (\$45), and changing the maximum occupancy for Tier 1 permits (\$180 if an inspection is required; \$90 if it isn't).

NOTE: The 10% permit application fee discount for STRs managed by licensed property managers is NOT proposed to change.

WHAT STR PERMIT APPLICATION FEES PAY FOR

STR permit application fees are intended to cover such things as: overall program administration, addressing inquiries, handling change requests, permit and renewal processing, monitoring by Host Compliance, operation of 24-hour complaint hotline, code enforcement investigation and responding to complaints/violations, plan review, safety inspections by building and fire personnel, permit software development/ enhancements, and other related items. Starting in 2023, permit application fees for STRs within the Tahoe Basin are also expected to cover some services by Clean Tahoe.
