TMFPD briefly

- 1972 County Bill #282 and Ordinance #188 formed the Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District
 - Sun Valley Volunteer Fire Department was one of twelve volunteer departments
- 1974 Sun Valley was one of the first career staffed stations
 - Glendale Ave. was the other
- 1980's TMFPD grew to 7 stations
- 1990's First to train FF's as EMTs and then intermediates, continued regional haz-mat team, developed water rescue program, and added hydraulic rescue tools to apparatus

2000 - 2012


TMFPD and City of Reno entered interlocal agreement for services.

2012 - Present

TMFPD has continued to expand service to Washoe County citizens

- Paramedics on all apparatus and ambulance transport services
- Chest compression devices (aiding in CPR effectiveness)
- Two rebuilt stations, two remodeled stations, one addition
- Two new stations in planning stages
- Wildland Fuels Division and Green Waste program added
- Administration/Fleet/Logistics building purchased
- Staff increased from 100 to 191
- Many apparatus purchases and other improvements to the district have and continue to occur

What do we do?

TMFPD serves over 1,000 square miles of unincorporated Washoe County

- Separate from the county but governed by the five Washoe County Commissioners
- Covers additional areas north of township 22 to include Rancho Haven and northern Palomino Valley
- More than fire response...
 - EMS, Wildland, Hazardous Materials, Water Rescue, Technical Rescue, Fire Prevention and Life Safety, Training
- Ten strategically located fire stations operate 24/7
 - 9 Fire engines, 1 Ladder/Engine, 3 Ambulances, 2 Battalion Chiefs
 - 40-45 personnel per day at full strength.



Sun Valley Responses (Engine/Brush 45)




- The same 3-person crew cross-staffs both units
- 89.5% of their calls were in Sun Valley
- The remaining were to assist in other district areas for all call types

2,446 Calls responded to in Sun Valley285 Calls responded to outside Sun Valley



Note: M45 responded to 1,859 calls in Sun Valley with and without E45/B45 or other units depending upon call type, available resources, concurrent calls, etc.





Sun Valley Responses (District 45)




Other units respond into Sun Valley when:

- Additional personnel or resources are needed to mitigate the incident such as a fire
- Concurrent calls happen
- District 45 units are out of service for training, mechanical, or other reasons
