Mission Statement

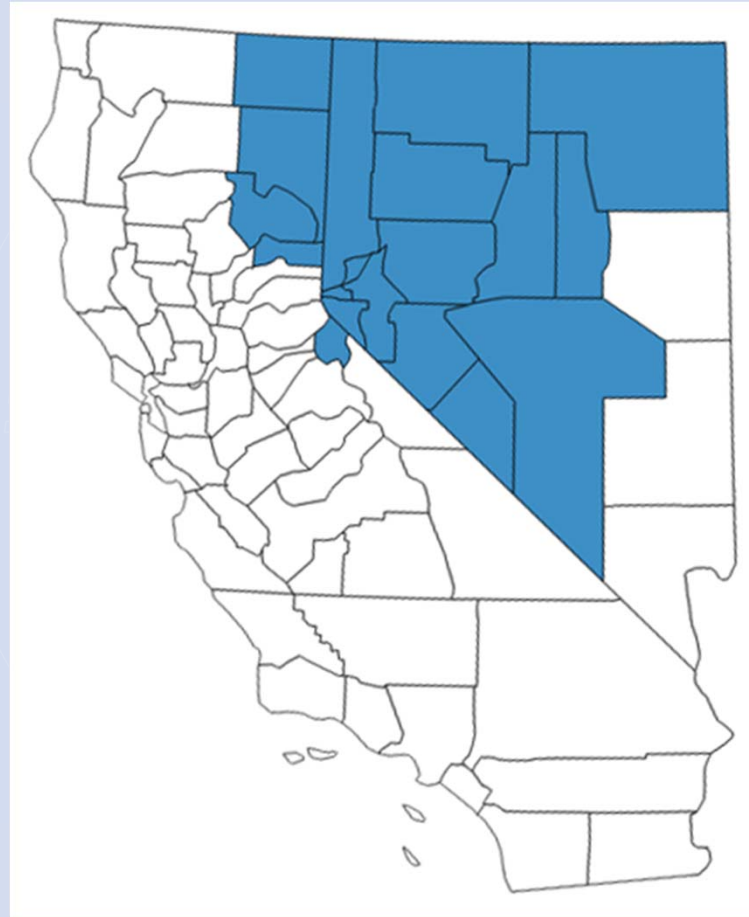
The mission of the WCRMEO is:

We apply scientific investigative techniques and medical procedures, using integrity and compassion, to serve families and public agencies impacted by sudden unexpected death.

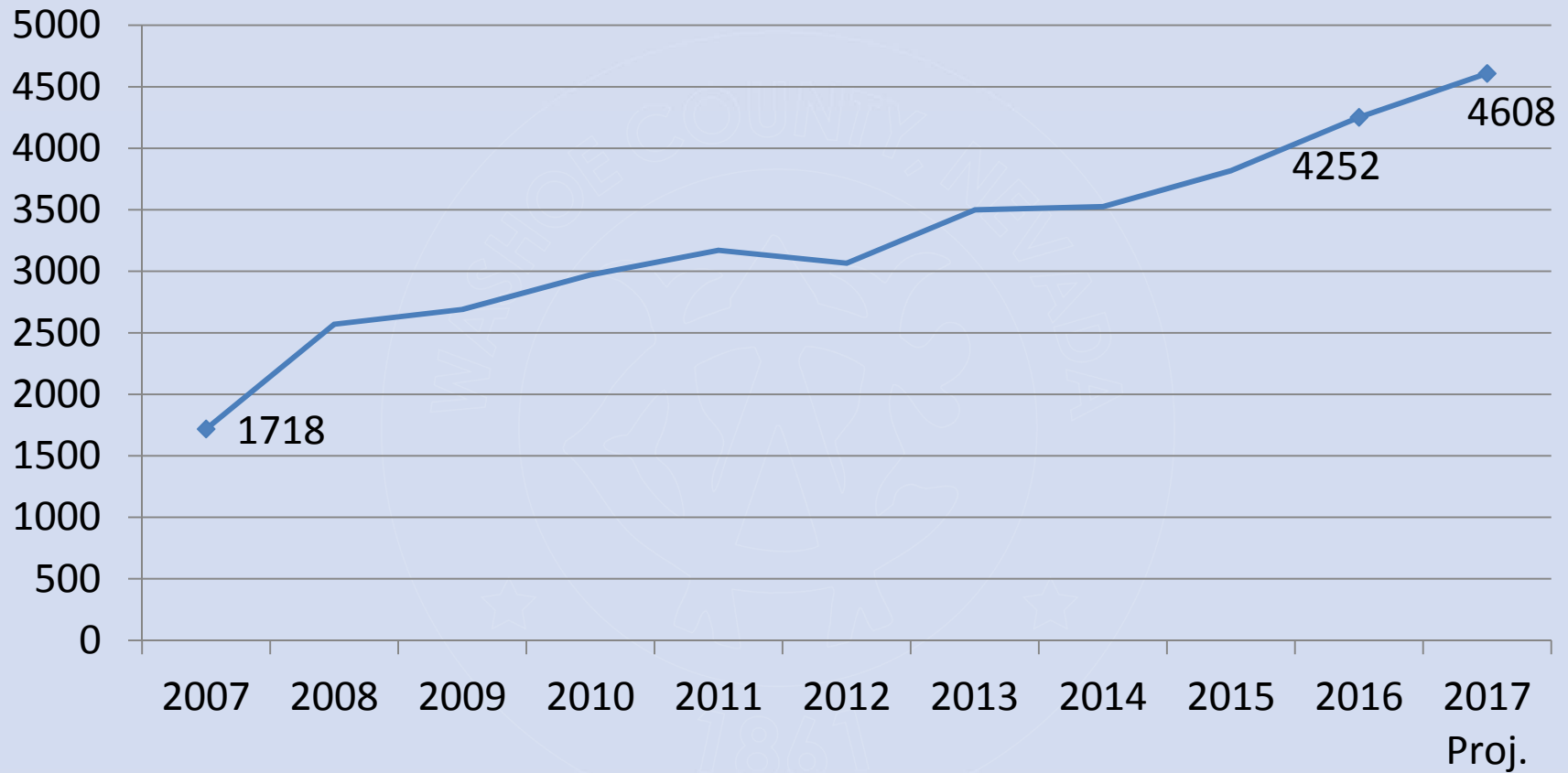

Drug Intoxication Deaths

*While 2016 saw a decrease in overall number of drug deaths, particularly prescription drug deaths, **methamphetamine** and **heroin** remain prevalent and increasingly are being combined with prescription drugs with an end result in death. **Designer drug** deaths also appeared in Washoe County in 2016, largely due to the illicit designer opioid drug U-47700.*

- **Majority (58%) aged 50-69**

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Washoe County Senior Deaths

There were 552 deaths at 65 years of age and older that met the criteria for Medical Examiner jurisdiction. Deaths in seniors present special challenges, such as the need to rule out neglect or abuse, and the propensity for ultimately lethal injury from simple falls.

2016 Statistics of Interest

- **1320 bodies were transported to and refrigerated at the Medical Examiner's Office.**
- **Toxicology testing was performed on 809 cases.**
- **There were zero (0) cases in which a decedent remained unidentified after thorough investigation.**
- **WCRMEO referred 157 unclaimed and abandoned decedents to the Washoe County Public Administrator's Office, and collaborated on further attempts to find and notify the NOK/responsible party.**
- **34 organ donations and 78 tissue donations were performed on Medical Examiner cases, with the full cooperation of the WCRMEO.**
