

Phase I Carryover

- > Landscaping
- Sprung floor sealing & additional safety needs
- >Indoor bathrooms & showers
- Fencing and gate (to enclose the campus)Pet Facilities
- Storage Lockers (additional needed)
- ➢ Paving and Manholes on Threlke Dr.

Phase II

➢Intake Office Secure Storage Cafeteria & Meals > 50 Bridge Housing Units Resource/Day Center (Central hub of homeless) services, coordinated entry & diversion services not just for shelter residents) Case Management and Office Space > Partitions for separation (best practice model) ≻Laundry > Facilities/Maintenance Area

> Buildings = 30,000 sq ft



> Sprung pop outs = 7,000 sq ft



Design, Construction Fees, Permits, FF&E Professional Services, Contingency


