ARPA-SLFRF Projects &

Affordable Housing Trust Fund - Community Foundation Agreement

### A. Public Defender Amendment

- Existing ARPA-SLFRF project to address Public Defender's Office case backlog due to the pandemic. Approved by BCC 12/14/2021
- Original Award: \$1,240,854 Staffing for five temporary positions, for 24 month
- Amendment: Increase to 48 months staffing, budget increase \$1,585,892 (total \$2,826,746)
- Justification:
  - Initial backlog predictions underestimated the workload.
  - Case complications that require more staff time (reopening of cases, longer case closing times) have reduced the projected case close rate.



### **B. Affordable Housing Trust Fund**

**Award Amount:** \$2,060,000

Award Manager: Washoe County Housing and Homeless Services

- Provides funding to housing developers through competitive solicitation process to increase and improve the supply of affordable housing.
- Focused on housing for low, very low and extremely low-income households, with priority given to permanent supportive housing projects affordable to extremely low-income households.
- Funding provides the opportunity for the county's AHTF to begin to fulfill the purpose it was established to achieve.



## **Item 15 – Community Foundation AHTF Contract**

• Item #15 Sole source contract award – Board of County Commissioners established the AHTF and entered into an agreement with the Community Foundation of Northern Nevada (CFNN) to administer the Fund.

### Contract:

- \$2,000,000 pass-through Affordable Housing loans/grants, and
- \$60,000 for administration of loans/grants through the AHTF.
- HHS will administer solicitation and award process; BCC will approve awards.
- CFNN will distribute funds per the BCC's direction, most likely in the form of 30-year deferred loans.



# C. Civil Rights and Equity Engagement

**Award Amount:** \$500,000

Award Manager: Washoe County Human Resources - Organizational

**Effectiveness Division** 

Scope of the award:

- Evaluate programs/services to support civil rights compliance (Federal, State, Local),
- Assess facility accessibility
- Develop an Action Plan based on analysis, and
- Provide related training for staff
- Contract Consultants No new staff



# D. Community Reinvestment Grant Program Round 2

Round 1 non-profit grants approved by BCC 10/25/2022

• 12 awards = \$1,021,113

Round 2 grants presented for approval 12/13/2022

• 11 awards = \$3,360,078

### **Total Awards**

- 23 nonprofits
- \$4,381,191.67



### **Round 2 Awardee Recommendations**

- 11 non-profit grants in the amount of \$3,360,078
- Round 2 awards larger, more complex with widespread community impact and strategic investments.
- All projects were consulted with partnering Washoe County departments to confirm alignment with department initiatives and goals.























#### **Note-Able Music Therapy Services** \$255,506

Expansion for musical therapy for Washoe County community members

#### **Food Bank of Northern Nevada** \$110,550

 Support of community kitchen design and construction in food insecure neighborhood

#### **Catholic Charities of Northern Nevada** \$483,708

 Workforce development programming for at-risk and on the edge community members to obtain soft skills training and work placement

#### **Domestic Violence Resource Center** \$97,130

 Creation of a Child Advocate position to coordinate childcare and family enrichment programming for families staying at the Center.

#### **Nevada Legal Services** \$243,200

 Holistic lawyering for low-income and people experiencing homelessness in Washoe County. Addition of a social worker to coordinate wraparound resources for their clients.

#### **Communities In Schools of Western Nevada** \$740,512

 Staffing support for 16 positions at 13 WCSD schools to coordinate mental health resources at school and beyond for students to improve socio-emotional wellbeing.

#### **High Sierra Area Health Education Center**

 Training program for high school students to become Certified Community Health Workers

#### The Life Change Center \$568,042

 Pilot program for an Opioid Treatment Induction Support Team to assist people recovering from opioid addiction in the first 90-days of recovery

#### ReDirect Youth Outreach \$133,965

 Youth boxing program to teach individuals how to regulate and redirect complex emotions. Priority participants will be for Washoe County youth involved in the foster system or juvenile services.

#### The Empowerment Center \$58,230

 Support for the new facility that opened on Marvel Way in October 2022.

### **Northern Nevada Literacy Council** \$345,485

 Adult basic education courses for individuals working toward high school equivalency and literacy.
