


2022







Agreement

- Agreement between Washoe County, Tianyu Arts & Culture and the May Arboretum Society was accepted by the Board of County Commissioners on Dec 10, 2019. Contract agreement duration of 5 years 2019-2023.
- Tianyu Arts & Culture was responsible for the majority of logistical detail (marketing, ticket sales, parking, daily clean-up, etc.).
- Agreed revenue split of 90/10 on the first \$1 million dollars, 85/15 any revenue over \$1 million dollars.









Timeline

- Festival set-up began 6/13/22
- County/MAS/VIP night on 6/30/22
- Opened to the public on 7/1/22
- 44 days of festival
 - One weather related closure (8/4/22)
 - Two additional days permitted to extend festival (8/13-8/14)
- Festival break down completed 8/19/22







Festival Statistics


Total attendance: 94,017 visitors

Average # of people/day: 2,044

Highest attendance: 3,946 (8/12)

Lowest attendance: 721 (7/4)











Revenue

- Total revenue \$1,852,601.46
- Washoe County received \$233,521.94
 - 10% = \$100,000.00 (<\$1M)
 - 15% = \$127,890.22 (>\$1M)
 - Other revenue (vendor, sponsorship) \$5,631.72
- Earnings placed in the May Arboretum Donation Account









Overhead Costs



- May Arboretum staff time
 - \$6,807.88
- Supplies
 - \$1,117.75
- Hardscape damages
 - \$64,747.92

Assessment

- Well received by the public after 2 years of COVID-19 restrictions
- Provided more publicity to the May Arboretum & Botanical Garden
- Festival will come back in 2023 during the same timeframe
- Negotiate future agreement to include frequency of event, operational dates, etc. (Autumn would be more ideal for protecting plants and enhance the light experience with darker days)
- Implement better mitigation efforts in protection Wilbur D May Arboretum
 & Botanical Garden's precious plant collection
