An item listed with an asterisk (*) next to it is an item for which no action will be taken. Items on the agenda may be taken out of order. The Senior Advisory Board conducts the business of Washoe County and its citizens during its meetings. The Chair may order the removal of any person whose statement or other conduct disrupts the orderly, efficient or safe conduct of the meeting. Warnings against disruptive comments or behavior may or may not be given prior to removal. The viewpoint of a speaker will not be restricted, but reasonable restrictions may be imposed upon the

time, place and manner of speech. Irrelevant and unduly repetitious statements and personal attacks, which antagonize or incite are examples of speech that may be reasonably limited.

Public Comment. Public Comment is limited to three (3) minutes per person. During the “Public Comment” items, anyone may speak pertaining to any matter either on or off the agenda. **As required by the Governor’s Declaration of Emergency Directive 006 Section 2, members of the public may submit public comment by teleconference by logging into the Zoom webinar by accessing the following link:**

Note this action will require a computer with audio and video capabilities. Additionally, public comment can be submitted via email to svasquez@washoecounty.us or by leaving a voice message at (775) 353-3110. For the remainder of the agenda, public comment will only be heard during items that are not marked with an asterisk (*). Any public comment for hearing items will be heard before action is taken on the item and must be about the specific item being considered by the Board. In order to speak during any public comment, each speaker must fill out a “Request to Speak” form and/or submit comments for the record to the Recording Secretary. Public comment is limited to three minutes for individual speakers

Response to Public Comment. The Board can deliberate or take action only if a matter has been listed on an agenda properly posted prior to the meeting. During the public comment period, speakers may address matters

listed or not listed on the published agenda. The *Open Meeting Law* does not expressly prohibit responses to public comments by the Board. However, responses from the Board members to unlisted public comment topics could become deliberation on a matter without notice to the public. On the advice of legal counsel and to ensure the public has notice of all matters the Board will consider, Board members may choose not to respond to public comments, except to correct factual inaccuracies, ask for Staff action or to ask that a matter be listed on a future agenda. The Board may do this either during the public comment item or during the following item: "Agenda Items for the next Board Meeting."
